

KIRK O' SHOTTS


THE FIRST black Maltese cross, the test signal of a new television service, was broadcast in Scotland on 15 January last. It was sent out from the new B.B.C. station at Kirk O'Shotts. Our part in this station has been doubly welcomed, for the test service was opened up on our medium power transmitters, and as the other manufacturers

have not yet "delivered the goods" in the form of the high power equipment, our transmitters will open the programme service on 14 March. The station will run for some months on our equipment before the high power unit is ready.
